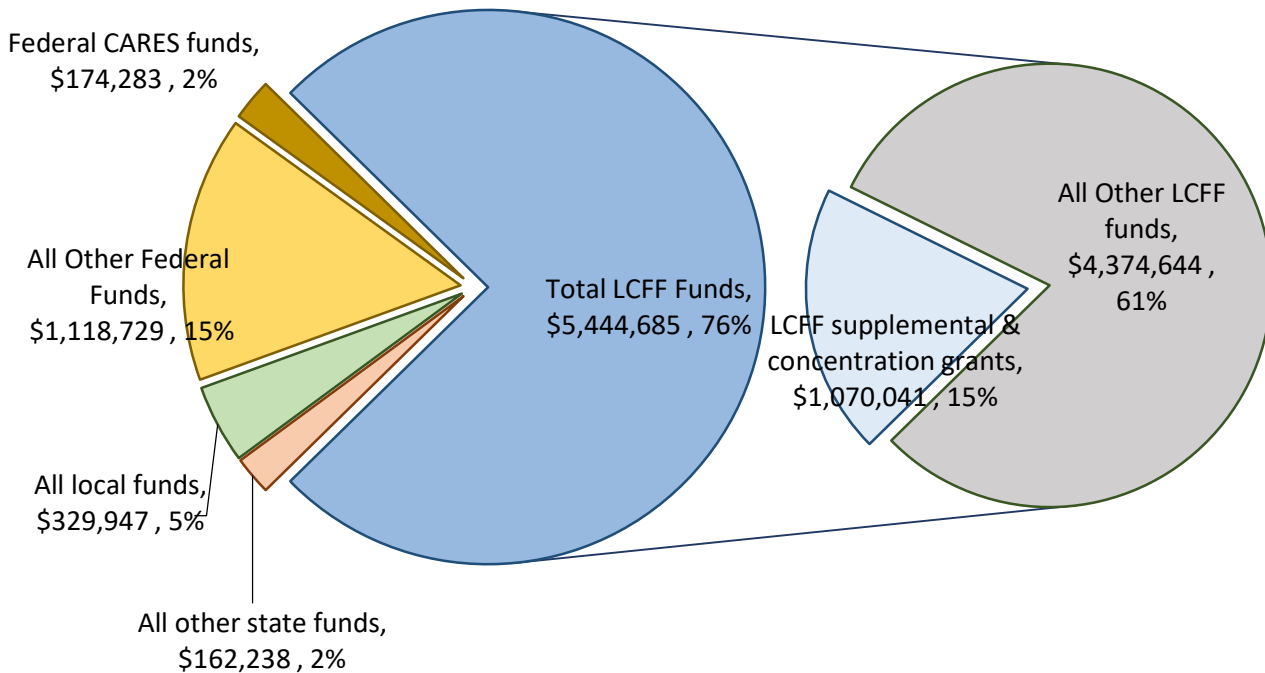

School districts receive funding from different sources: state funds under the Local Control Funding Formula (LCFF), other state funds, local funds, and federal funds. LCFF funds include a base level of funding for all LEAs and extra funding - called "supplemental and concentration" grants - to LEAs based on the enrollment of high needs students (foster youth, English learners, and low-income students).

## Budget Overview for the 2020-2021 School Year

### Projected Revenue by Fund Source

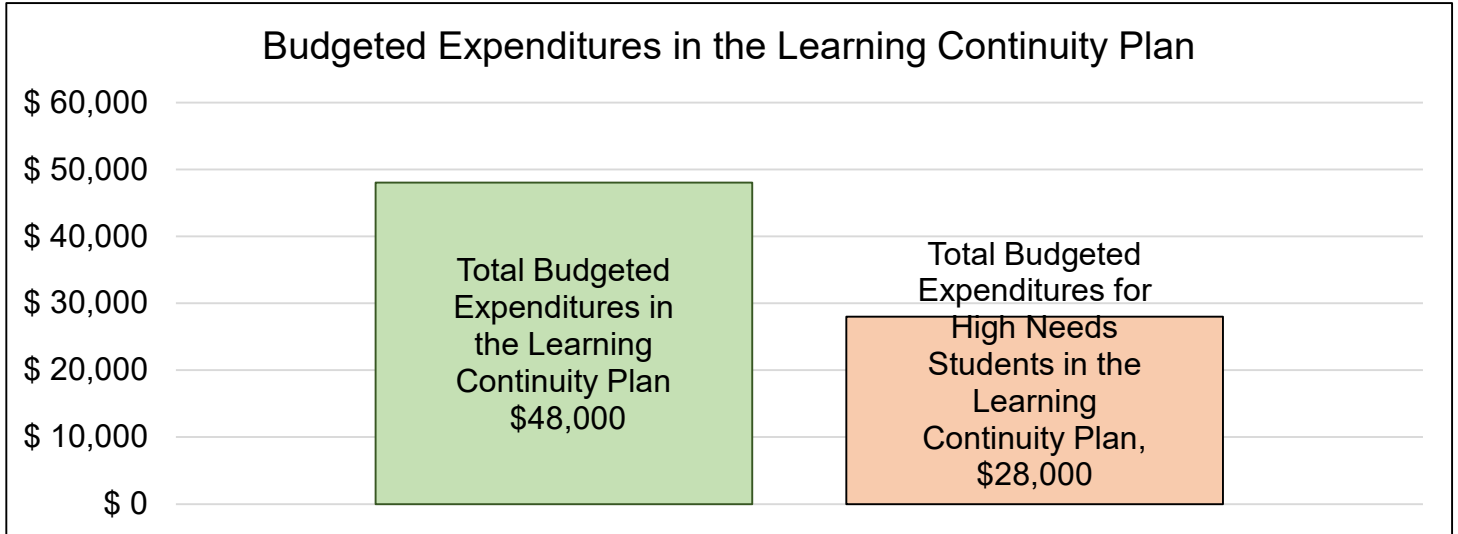


This chart shows the total general purpose revenue St. HOPE Public School 7 expects to receive in the coming year from all sources.

The total revenue projected for St. HOPE Public School 7 is \$7,229,882.00, of which \$5,444,685.00 is Local Control Funding Formula (LCFF) funds, \$162,238.00 is other state funds, \$329,947.00 is local funds, and \$1,293,012.00 is federal funds. Of the \$1,293,012.00 in federal funds, \$174,283.00 are federal CARES Act funds. Of the \$5,444,685.00 in LCFF Funds, \$1,070,041.00 is generated based on the enrollment of high needs students (foster youth, English learner, and low-income students).

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For the 2020-21 school year school districts must work with parents, educators, students, and the community to develop a Learning Continuity and Attendance Plan (Learning Continuity Plan). The Learning Continuity Plan replaces the Local Control and Accountability Plan (LCAP) for the 2020–21 school year and provides school districts with the opportunity to describe how they are planning to provide a high-quality education, social-emotional supports, and nutrition to their students during the COVID-19 pandemic.



This chart provides a quick summary of how much St. HOPE Public School 7 plans to spend for planned actions and services in the Learning Continuity Plan for 2020-2021 and how much of the total is tied to increasing or improving services for high needs students.

St. HOPE Public School 7 plans to spend \$5,626,923.00 for the 2020-2021 school year. Of that amount, \$48,000.00 is tied to actions/services in the Learning Continuity Plan and \$5,578,923.00 is not included in the Learning Continuity Plan. The budgeted expenditures that are not included in the Learning Continuity Plan will be used for the following:

General Fund expenditures for the '20-21 school year are allocated the standard expenses necessary to operate the school. Including but not limited to staffing, rent, utilities, internet, material and supplies.

## Increased or Improved Services for High Needs Students in in the Learning Continuity Plan for the 2020-2021 School Year

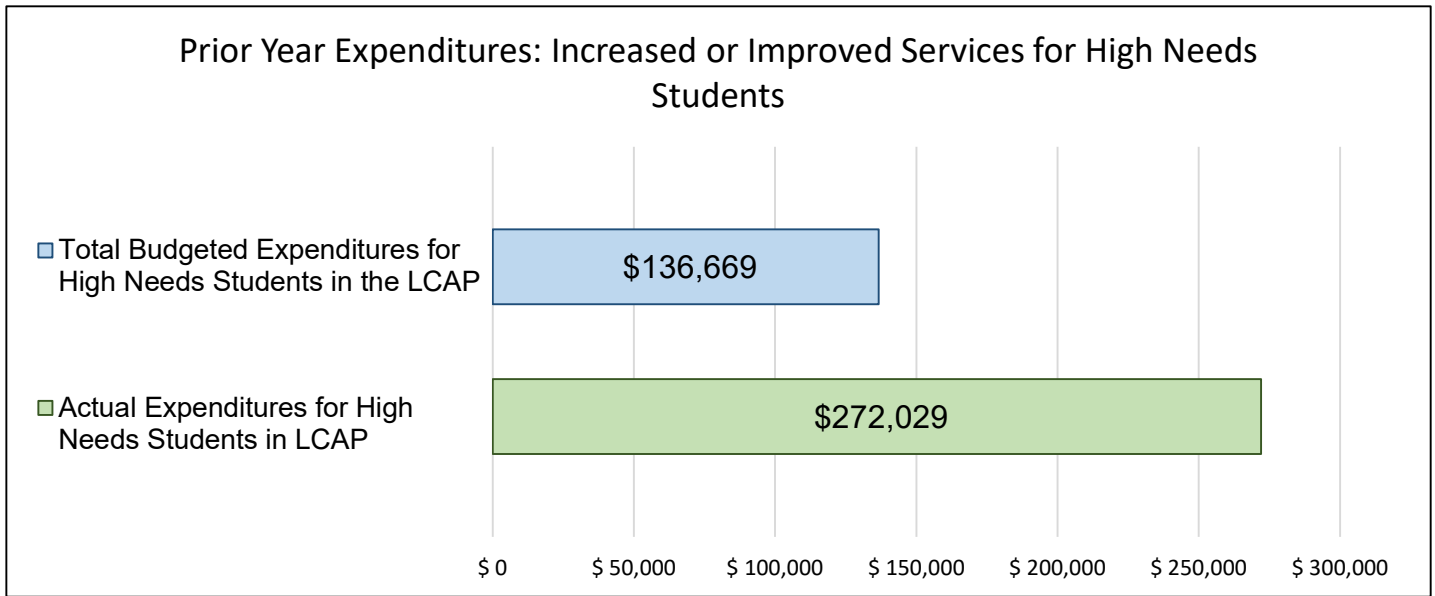
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In 2020-2021, St. HOPE Public School 7 is projecting it will receive \$1,070,041.00 based on the enrollment of foster youth, English learner, and low-income students. St. HOPE Public School 7 must describe how it intends to increase or improve services for high needs students in the Learning Continuity Plan. St. HOPE Public School 7 plans to spend \$28,000.00 towards meeting this requirement, as described in the Learning Continuity Plan. The additional improved services described in the plan include the following:

The school uses an inclusion model for EL, special education and 504 students. PS7 spends the additional supplemental and concentration grants on professional development and staffing, in particular providing teaching assistants (TAs) in core classes that are identified to to meet the needs of English Learners (ELs) and special education students. These supports are also available to low-income students, foster students, and students experiencing homelessness. These expenditures were not included in the 20-21 Learning Continuity Plan as they are not specific to distance learning or the hybrid models developed specifically for the 20-21 school years.

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## Update on Increased or Improved Services for High Needs Students in 2019-2020



This chart compares what St. HOPE Public School 7 budgeted in the 2019-20 LCAP for actions and services that contributed to increasing or improving services for high needs students with what St. HOPE Public School 7 actually spent on actions and services that contributed to increasing or improving services for high needs students in the 2019-20 school year.

In 2019-2020, St. HOPE Public School 7's LCAP budgeted \$136,669.00 for planned actions to increase or improve services for high needs students. St. HOPE Public School 7 actually spent \$272,029.00 for actions to increase or improve services for high needs students in 2019-2020.
