We are pleased to inform you that St. HOPE Public Schools will be implementing a new option available to schools participating in the National School Lunch and School Breakfast Programs called the Community Eligibility Provision (CEP) for the 2018-2019 school year.

Schools that participate in the CEP are able to provide healthy breakfasts and lunches each day at no charge for all students during the school year.

This means your student(s) enrolled at St. HOPE Public School 7, Oak Park Preparatory Academy or Sacramento Charter High School is eligible to receive one free breakfast and one free lunch each school day they are in attendance during designated meal times. There is no need for families to apply for this program. Every enrolled student qualifies.
