Minimum Qualifications:

Any combination of training and experience which would likely provide the required knowledges and abilities is qualifying. A typical way to obtain these knowledges and abilities would be:

- I. At least one (1) year in a classification equivalent to a SETA Head Start Specialist;
- OR II. One (1) year of specialized experience that includes working with quality assurance/monitoring methods, principles and practices, dealing with the problems of young children and their families; AND

Education:

I. An AA degree or higher in Social Science, Human Development, or in a related field;

OR

II. A Basic Health Service Credential or a Basic Family Services Credential issued by the National Head Start Association is highly desirable.

HOW TO APPLY:
